### Stop and Report a #HitchHikerBug

#### 1. Take a picture:

With the GPS function turned on your cellphone or camera with GPS, take a photograph of any life stage (including egg masses). Upload your photo to Facebook or Instagram, using the hashtag #HitchHikerBug.

If you don't have GPS capabilities and/or access to social media, submit the photo via email to: **HitchHikerBug@state.de.us** Include your name, contact information, and the address or georeference of where the photo was taken.

#### 2. Collect a specimen:

Suspected specimens of any life stage can be collected and placed in a vial or plastic zip-lock bag with the name and contact information of the collector, and turned in to the Delaware Department of Agriculture CAPS program for verification.
