Our Mission

The Delaware Forest Service provides a wide range of services to help Delawareans manage and improve their forest resources. These services are divided into three categories: **conservation**, **protection**, and **education**.

Forest Stewardship/Landowner Assistance

- Most owners of nonindustrial private forests are eligible
- Keeps forests healthy while maximizing their benefits
- Provides natural resource management expertise
- Cost-share programs are also available
- Landowner assistance in:
 - Timber production
 - Wildlife habitat
 - Forest health monitoring (diseases/pests)
 - Watershed protection
 - Recreational assistance

Wildland Fire Program

- Minimizes fire damage through prevention and suppression activities
- Loans wildland fire suppression tools to volunteer fire companies
- Provides educational programs (Smokey Bear) for students and various public events
- Partners with the Delaware Fire School, fire companies, and U.S. Forest Service
- Other fire assistance includes:
 - Volunteer Fire Assistance
 - Volunteer Fire Assistance Grants
 - Hazard Mitigation Program
 - Prescribed Fire Program

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Urban & Community Forestry

- Administers technical assistance and educational programming
- Partners with various State groups, schools, colleges, and U.S. Forest Service
- Provides financial assistance to communities, municipalities, and HOA's
- Promotes and assists with tree recognition programs
- Provides volunteer opportunities at tree-planting events
- Urban forestry resources for:
 - Homeowners
 - Communities
 - Tree care professionals

Forest Health

- Recommend treatments to property owners
- Detect trends in the long-term health of our forests
- Diagnoses and monitors forest pests, such as:
 - Asian Longhorned Beetle, Southern Pine Beetle, Spongy Moth, Spotted Lanternfly

- Education centers located at Redden State Forest and Blackbird State Forest
